Dear Parents,

We've had a wonderful and very busy week in school. It has been a joy to see children begin to make Christmas decorations and see the hall busy with children rehearsing for their Christmas nativities.

Thank you to all those who celebrated the Feast of Christ the King at the 11.30am Youth Sunday Mass at Holy Family Church last week; it was lovely to see past pupils and staff again. Thank you also to our Year 6 Faith Ambassadors who spoke after the Gospel and signed the Hail Mary; you all did a fantastic job and represented our school so well. To have the opportunity to reconnect with staff and children who have left our school was lovely and hopefully we will continue to strengthen the ambition of lifelong belonging to our school and parish community through an annual reunion/alumni Mass on the Feast of Christ the King.

Year 6 had a wonderful day on Monday, as they came to school as World War II evacuees! They looked fantastic in their costumes and many had made gas mask boxes and evacuee labels to wear. During the day the children had the opportunity to make their own gas masks and create some Blitz art, amidst being interrupted by the air raid siren and having to cower under desks! They ended their day with learning the lindy-hop as part of a tea-dance, and having a World War II sing-a-long.

On Wednesday, our Year 6 children also enjoyed an afternoon at Langley Free Church where they learned about the true meaning of Christmas in a fun, interactive way. The children enjoyed many activities such as: making Christmas cookies, learning a rap and even took part in a couple of quizzes. They thoroughly enjoyed their afternoon, saying it was 'an amazing experience' and 'it was incredibly funny.' Thank you, Langley Free Church for the effort and enthusiasm you put into the Christmas Unwrapped afternoon for our children every year - we really appreciate it!

Today, our Nursery children learnt about St Andrew and how he became the Saint of Scotland and fishermen. They looked at where Scotland is on a map, looked at the Scottish flag and made their own, and decorated bookmarks that the Faith Ambassador for Nursery, Hollie (Year

6), gave to them as a gift to colour in and keep. They enjoyed wearing their blue and white clothes to school too.

Thank you to all our Parents who support events in school by providing costumes, assisting classes walk to the library, supporting football fixtures and much more.

Senior leaders spent Wednesday hosting two visiting professionals from St Thomas Academies Trust as we completed a collaborative Early Reading Review. The focus was how well we teach reading to our youngest pupils in addition to how the teaching of reading is continued throughout KS2. The review was very successful and provided external validation that staff are knowledgeable and highly skilled at teaching reading from Reception to Year 6. It was also noted that the culture of behaviour and conduct means children are enabled and "children's daily diet is really reliable, resulting in cumulative knowledge and skills".

EYFS/KS1 Nativities

We are looking forward to seeing our EYFS and KS1 parents attend their children's nativity during the week beginning 9th December. Please note that we will not be filming our nativities. We want you to come and enjoy them. Parents are welcome to film if they stand at the back of the hall. Parents must not stand in the seating area, or hold phones or iPads up to film from the seating area, as this obscures the view of those behind.
