Dear Parents

We close this term having had two fabulous event-filled weeks. Last week's nativities and gymnastics shows were all joyful celebrations showcasing how confident and talented our children are.

This week began with Year 2 arriving at school dressed as Explorers for an exciting DT focused day in which they made vehicles for their explorers. Also on Monday, our youngest children enjoyed the magician who entertained them at their Christmas party. On Tuesday, teachers of children in Years 1-6 organised party games and everyone had fun at the disco with exparent (Anthony Beauchamp) playing floor-filler music in the hall. Thank you for fantastic party hats which we know some parents enjoy making more than others!

Wednesday was 'all-hands-on-deck' to serve 450 Christmas lunches, which went incredibly smoothly. My thanks to our hardworking kitchen assistants and every member of staff who helped the service.

Our final Christmas event last night saw Year 6 welcome their parents to a spectacular World War 2 Christmas performance. Narrators told a story of enduring friendship; the audience experienced the sights and sounds of family trying to celebrate Christmas in the 1940s whilst being interrupted by air raid sirens and wardens directing them to a bunker. The energy children brought to the performance was incredible. Year 6 sang with enthusiasm, Riley and Veer were expert stage hands controlling the lights while other children created a nativity tableau. Well done to all our Year 6 children and staff team.

Term concluded with an especially joyful and celebratory assembly this morning. We celebrated sporting achievements, the excellent contribution our Faith Ambassadors make to school, children who always meet behaviour expectations, the 99 children who have attended every day since September and much more.

At the end of our first term as part of St Thomas Academy Trust we have worked with many new strategic leaders, systems and procedures. There has been little change for children and teaching staff other than increased visitors walking around school assessing how well they teach and learn. We said a fond farewell to our business manager last week as we adapt to working with an Account Manager who oversees three Trust schools and is based at Holy Family every Tuesday. One less person in our administration team has led to a change in gate duty. From January there will only be one member of staff outside at the end of the day to ensure no one is cycling or scooting on site, and to supervise our older children who leave school unaccompanied. Gates will no longer be monitored in the afternoon as the vast majority of children are collected from the classroom door by their adults. Please remind all children if they are separated from parents at pick up or on the way home they must return to the main office at school and we respectfully request increased vigilance from parents.

On behalf of all staff, I thank you for your generosity with kind and encouraging words and gifts for staff. It is absolutely not necessary but is always very much appreciated by all. Your words are impactful and cherished as they make staff feel valued.

Also on behalf of all staff, governors and the leaders of St Thomas Academies Trust, we wish you a wonderful blessed Christmas with family and friends. Through God's grace we hope you experience joy and peace in equal measure.

Financial support grants

The council has joined up with Lightning Reach, a financial support portal where residents can easily find and apply for a range of help. Individuals can complete a profile by answering a simple 10–15-minute questionnaire. Once the profile is complete, they will be able to see the available support they may be eligible for in one place, get updated when more support is added, and apply for multiple sources of support directly through the portal. This can include targeted help with energy bills, home improvements to boost energy efficiency, warm clothing, and essential winter supplies.

Household Support Fund

The HSF scheme has been running for several years and new funding means it can be extended until 31 March 2025.

The grant of \pounds 1,177,691.53 is funded by the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) and it is designed to help low-income households such as families with children, pensioners, unpaid carers, care leavers and disabled people.

Applications can be made if you meet the eligibility criteria and the money is to cover basic living costs such as energy, food, water bills, essential goods and housing costs, as a last resort, only where existing housing support scheme do not meet the needs.
