Dear Parents and Carers

Our first class assembly of the year was a beautiful celebration of the RE topic Year 5 have been learning about: Finding our mission in life. They reminded us of words from John Henry Newman (we are all here to do some definite service) and Mother Teresa (if you can't feed 100 people, feed 1) in addition to how our small acts of kindness and compassion make a big difference. If we choose the right actions we can build a better world. The church calls this CST: Catholic Social Teaching. This was the first time our youngest children have joined an assembly and they did very well. It took us a while to get everyone sat down but we will get quicker as the year goes on. Well done all.

On Wednesday, two netball teams represented Holy Family at a tournament held at St Bernard's School. Our girls were very excited yet came up against some strong teams. This was our first netball tournament for a few years so we are grateful to Mrs Lynch, Mrs Henriquez and Mr Holder for training our girls and organising the event. We plan to be even more competitive at next year's tournament.

Staff are enjoying engaging with new St Thomas Catholic Academies Trust colleagues and feeling part of a larger organisation. This week, school leaders have worked with our Strategic Executive Leader, Mr Richardson, and Executive School Improvement Advisor, Mr Stapleton (St Joseph's Headteacher). Year 6 teachers have collaborated with colleagues from St Anthony's and St Ethelbert's and Mr Thercaj (Eddie) travelled to Luton to meet the wider premises team. Staff at all levels are certainly widening our connections as we engage with new people and procedures that come with belonging to a large organisation.

Earlier in the week, I was surprised to see two people from our own school community on television. First I saw Chey, mum of Tyra Grewal in Year 2, who is completing a personal challenge in the lead up to Children in Need. I look forward to seeing more of her journey as reported on BBC local news. Secondly, Tanisha Muir, a past pupil, appeared on The One Show as one of four young people chosen to launch the Children In Need Fundraising Squad Challenge. Tanisha has a personal connection to Thames Valley Hospice, as the Hospice supported her during her father's inspirational fight with cancer. Further updates on Tanisha's progress with her challenge, and also the three other young people, will be shown on the One Show over the next few weeks in the lead up to the main Children In Need event on Friday 15th November.

Sunday 20th is World Mission Sunday. The theme Pope Francis has chosen is to invite people to the banquet of the Kingdom of God. It is based on the Parable of the Wedding Feast in Chapter 22 of St Mathew's Gospel; 'Go and invite everyone to the banquet'. To be human means to make mistakes and we need to forgive ourselves and others readily and accept God's constant invitation of salvation. Additionally, we invite you to put Sunday 24th November 11.30am in your diary. This date marks the Feast of Christ The King which is also known as Youth Sunday. We invite our entire school community, past and present, to joyfully celebrate what it means to belong to our thriving Catholic community at the 11.30am Mass at Holy Family Church on 24th November. All are warmly welcomed to join school staff for refreshments after Mass.

Along with this newsletter you should also receive a letter explaining the new higher expectations regarding children's attendance at school.

From the 4th November we respectfully request that if parents choose to send in a treat for their child's birthday this should only be a small bag of Haribo's or similar.

Temple, Birmingham. There were artists performing from all over the UK and Abigail performed very confidently in front of a huge audience in the traditional dance costume.


Congratulations to Devante Romney (Year 4) on being awarded the intermediate red belt in Martial Arts.

Admission to Reception September 2025

The above admission round is now open and closes on 15th January 2025. You must apply via your local authority website completing a Common Application Form (CAF) for a place in a Reception class to start September 2025.

In addition to completing a CAF, please complete our Supplementary Form (Called 'Reception School Supplementary Form 2025 2026' on our website) and return with the relevant supporting documents to Holy Family Catholic School by 15th January 2025. Reception Supplementary Forms can be obtained from the school website or the school office.
