Dear Parents and Carers,

We hope you all enjoyed half term and children have had a good first week back. Children were certainly full of smiles and pleased to see their friends again on Monday.

This morning's assembly was moving and reverent. Miss Macfarlane's class reminded us of the sacrifice of fallen soldiers, the significance of the poppy and the importance of showing kindness and compassion to everyone. Year 2 should feel very proud of themselves, especially as they only had one week to practice.

Our youngest children were delighted to welcome their parents to Nursery Stay and Play and Reception Stay and Read. So many parents chose to come and spend time in their child's class which was an absolute joy for everyone. Staff were delighted by the turnout and seeing the lovely interactions between children and parents. Nursery thoroughly enjoyed showing their parents what they do in our Nursery and outside on the playground. Parents helped paint pumpkins, make firework pictures, make potions, played with spiders in the water tray, had broomstick races and retold the story of Room On The Broom around the cauldron! In addition to the above Mrs Doyle led a whole school 'welcome back' assembly on Monday, Year 5 have been swimming, Mrs O'Reilly accompanied our 15 Faith Ambassadors to a day of spiritual reflection at St Bernard's, two classes visited the library and we welcomed a strategic leader from St Thomas for two days....so it's been a typically busy week.


Congratulations to Lea Rogulska who has moved up to Stage 6 in her swimming lessons having only moved to Stage 5 in June. Well done Lea.

Attendance

Year 6 Residential Trip – May 2025

We have 47 children confirmed to attend the residential trip next May and have extended the deadline for confirming attendance to Friday 15th November. If your child has not yet returned their reply slip, please can we kindly ask that they do so by 15th November (please return a reply slip even if your child will not be attending the residential). Thank you.

Early Years Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

We would encourage all parents to consider if they can apply for additional funding from the Government in relation to their child, namely the Early Years Pupil Premium and Free School Meals (see below for further information). If the Early Years Pupil Premium is applicable, school could get up to £388 per year to help with children's education. If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, school may be able to apply for a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) and receive additional income for use in school. Although a PPG is not a personal budget for your child, it may mean school can then help with offering your child school trips at a reduced price/help with uniform costs, etc, in addition to your child receiving free school meals. There is absolutely no stigma within school regarding these benefits and it will be dealt with in the strictest of confidence and every penny in funding is needed by school.
