
Weekly Sports Update

Marking and Feedback Explanation

Recently, our teachers have been working hard to update our Marking and Feedback Policy to better support your children's learning and progress. The revised policy focuses on providing constructive, timely, and meaningful feedback that helps children understand their strengths and areas for improvement. Teachers will ensure that feedback is clear and accessible for children of all ages and abilities, using a mixture of strategies. Love Christmas Campaign – Bags of Kindness – Friday 6th December MUFTI DAY

We would like to build on your wonderful generosity last year and request your help in supporting the Diocesan Love Christmas Campaign again this year. On Friday 6th December, we invite children to wear their own clothes to school in exchange for bringing in donations of much needed gifts to put smiles on the faces of young families, children and the elderly living in isolation and poverty, as well as young people leaving the care system and living alone, and young carers who do so much all year round for others and have little time to actually be a child.

Donations needed include a range of small items such as: selection boxes, small toys, books, games, colouring books, puzzles, shortbread, biscuits, sweets or chocolate, clothing such as scarfs, hats, gloves, games that can be played as a family, make up, nail varnish, hand cream and other treats, with the goal of both helping each recipient to feel the warmth of human connection and the joy of Christmas and to know that someone is thinking of them and cares for them.

Please can we kindly ask that all donations be brought into school by Friday 6th December and passed to either your child's class teacher or the School Office (please do not wrap any gifts).

Early Years Pupil Premium and Free School Meals

We would encourage all parents to consider if they can apply for additional funding from the Government in relation to their child, namely the Early Years Pupil Premium and Free School Meals (see below for further information). If the Early Years Pupil Premium is applicable, school could get up to £388 per year to help with children's education. If your child is entitled to Free School Meals, school may be able to apply for a Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) and receive additional income for use in school. Although a PPG is not a personal budget for your child, it may mean school can then help with offering your child school trips at a reduced price/help with uniform costs, etc, in addition to your child receiving free school meals. There is absolutely no stigma within school regarding these benefits and it will be dealt with in the strictest of confidence and every penny in funding is needed by school.

If you do feel this is something your child may be entitled to, we would encourage you to speak to Mrs Conlon, our Children's Champion, in complete confidence.
