Dear Parents

Welcome back, and I hope everyone had an enjoyable half term. We have started the final half term of the year with an incredibly busy and eventful week and it looks as though this has set the tone from now until July 25th!

Children started new exercise books when they returned to school on Tuesday. We find this beneficial in maintaining children's progress as they move from one teacher to the next as, after the long summer break, some children regress slightly. This helps teachers to have high expectations of the classwork your children produce at the beginning of the new school year.

Year 4 are using the iPads to complete their statutory timetables assessments this week. So far, children have approached this with confidence. Well done Year 4.

Two classes have enjoyed trips to Langley Library and Miss Macfarlane's class loved their photoshoot preview of our very own library, 'Whispering Pages'. Following the governors' decision to join St Thomas Catholic academy trust on 1st September we showcased our school to a website photographer on Thursday. From September, we will move to the St Thomas style website platform that many of you will be familiar with if you have children at St Joseph's Catholic High School.

Thanks to Miss Macfarlane and Mrs Green our library has been designed around the theme of an enchanted wood. Mrs Green has used her creative skills to paint the back drops; we have reused the book shelves from our previous library and added some interesting seating. Miss Macfarlane has managed to secure a vast array of new books which will further improve our library when they arrive. For the remainder of this half term the library will only be open to children during the school day. During the next academic year, we hope to welcome parents and siblings too.

To celebrate the opening of our library on Wednesday (12th June), we are excited to be welcoming poet Zohab Zee Khan; all year groups will have the fantastic opportunity to take part in a poetry and performance session with him. Next week, we hope children will tell you all about our new library and our special visitor.

We are the sort of school that likes to say yes when offered opportunities. Year 3 enjoyed Nathan Pons, an experienced Slough Town (STFC) football coach, teaching them for PE this week. We look forward to strengthening our links with STFC during this six week coaching offer. Similarly, Slough School Sports Network offered Holy Family a dance teacher for six weeks. We were delighted when Aaron Collier, an ex-pupil, arrived to work with Year 6 for six weeks. Aaron explained how his career as a choreographer, dancer and in musical theatre was ignited by attending Alan's after school Street dance classes and performing in his Year 6 leavers' performance here at Holy Family. How fabulous that he has returned to share his passion for dancing with our children.



Year 4 – Multiplication Tables Check

Please be aware that the Year 4 Multiplication Tables Checks (MTC) have been taking place this week and will continue next week also. This is statutory for all Year 4 pupils, and checks their knowledge of their 1 - 12 multiplication tables. The purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics.

The school photographer will be in school on Tuesday 11th June for class photographs. Please ensure your child is wearing smart uniform. If your child would usually have PE on Tuesday 11th, please can they arrive at school in their school uniform, with their PE kit in a bag. Thank you.
