
Amazing Achievements

Easter Holiday Camp

Mr Holder will be running our popular Easter Camp during the first week of the Easter holiday. A booking form was emailed to parents yesterday (and is attached to this newsletter also) and places will be allocated on a first come first served basis. The Easter Camp will run from 7^{th} - 11^{th} April and is open to children from Reception to Year 6. We reserve the right not to go ahead with this club if we do not receive sufficient bookings by Monday 31^{st} March.

Site Security

Children's safety is our number one priority and, having reviewed how we operate either end of the school day, we will be trialling a few changes from Monday 23rd March until the Easter holiday. During this period, we will continue to 'tweak' our procedures until we feel we have the right system. In line with many other schools, we wish to achieve a secure site from the moment the first child enters our care (7.45am, when Early Birds starts) until the last child leaves our care (5.45pm, when Late Owls closes). Therefore, the pedestrian gate will remain shut every morning apart from morning drop off 8.40-9am.

No parents will be permitted to wait on the playground during the period 3.30-4.30pm and watch after school clubs. The member of staff who supervises the gates 3.15-3.40pm will also ensure every parent has left the playground. The gate at the side of our Year 3 classrooms will be locked. Parents will no longer pick up from after school clubs on the playground. Instead, Mr Holder and Icon Football Academy staff will walk children around to the gate at the side of Year 3 classrooms and dismiss children to their adult when they see them. This may slow down parents who are picking up children slightly and so I appreciate your patience next week. For many clubs such as gymnastics and Streetdance, parents gather outside the main reception and children are dismissed from the school door, and this feels more secure, and more inline with how children are dismissed from classrooms at the end of the school day.

All parents collecting from Late Owls are buzzed in by staff running that club. (We are aware the gate release is temperamental at the moment and we intend that this will be fixed during the Easter holiday). Please can you collect by walking past the Nursery playground. The Nursery gate will remain unlocked at the end of the school day to facilitate this, however, we respectfully ask that no parents collecting from after school sports clubs enter further into the school site than the main reception.

The pedestrian gate next to the vehicle gate will open at 4.25pm to enable parents to gather near main reception to pick up. If parents travel on public transport and wish to wait on site they will be able to buzz to enter the site but we ask you to wait on/near the four benches immediately inside the school gates.

Thank you for your support and understanding as we work out a slightly new system to further increase our security; we hope you understand how we are prioritising the safety of our children.

The Big Lent Walk

We are going to be walking to raise money for CAFOD to help fight global poverty.

When planning our pilgrimage around school to take part in The Big Lent Walk, we noticed that the number 7 featured regularly.

The number 7 is mentioned over 700 times in the bible and is seen in nature through the 7 colours of the rainbow, 7 continents, 7 days of the week and God created the world in 7 days.

During each of the 7 pilgrimages, the 7 year groups will lap the school 7 times, stopping for 7 moments of reflection and consider our 7 areas of Catholic Social Teaching. The walks will take place during the last 2 weeks of the Lent Term.

CAFOD suggest the children getting sponsored for their walk. However, we are a cashless school so are suggesting a donation made on Parent Pay between £1 and £10 which will be donated to CAFOD.

Studybugs - New System for Reporting Absences

Following a successful trial of the Studybugs absence reporting app with Year 6, we will be rolling this out across school for all pupils from April 2025. This app is used to report absences to school. We will be asking all parents and carers to download the app and use this instead of emailing or calling school to report absences. A letter with further information/instructions will be provided to parents/carers before the end of this term.

Multiplication Tables

Year 4 parents may already know that there will be a Multiplication Tables Check for all Year 4 children in June. There will be 25 questions of mixed times tables up to 12×12 . All schools will be taking part in the check each year as it is now part of the standard testing for schools.

All Key Stage 2 children should be practising their times tables weekly as part of their homework and can use Times Tables Rockstars to do so. This is especially important for Years 3 and 4. We recommend using https://www.timestables.co.uk/multiplication-tables-check/ as it is similar to how the Times Tables Check will look. Please encourage your children to practise regularly.

Phonics

If you would like to continue to support your child at home with their phonics, the following links below might be useful.
