## BOUNDARIES OF THE PARISH OF ST AUGUSTINE, DATCHET (2015 clarification)

These descriptions are intended to be read in conjunction with an Ordnance Survey 1:50,000 scale map, and a 1:25,000 one if possible, and possibly a large-scale street map.

Beginning at the most northerly point and running clockwise

- 1. Starting from the point where the M4 motorway crosses the A322 Windsor Road
- 2. Along the centre-line of the M4 motorway east, curving south-east and ENE to the point where it is crossed (just before Junction 5) by the civic boundary between Slough Borough Council and the Royal Borough of Windsor & Maidenhead. See **Map A**
- 3. South-east along that civic boundary passing SW of Colnbrook and west of Poyle so as to exclude them
- 4. Following that boundary SW and south along the western shore of the Wraysbury Reservoir, south-east along the Windsor-Staines railway, SSW along the western edge of the M25 motorway in the vicinity of Junction 13, then continuing along the civic boundary as it bends east and south to a point in mid-Thames about 800 feet west of a bend in Church Street, Staines, and a little downstream from the Egham Water and Gas Works on the south bank, where it meets the Spelthorne Borough Council boundary on the east and Runnymede BC on the south see Map B. (This is the southernmost point of the Diocese of Northampton.)
- 5. From there, back north-west and north along the centre-line of the River Thames to where the river is crossed by the A322 west of Eton.
- 6. North along the centre-line of the A322, continuing north along the A355 when the A322 bends east, to where the A355 crosses the M4 at Junction 6.
- 7. From the centre-point of the junction roundabout east to our starting point.

Main villages and neighbourhoods included: Datchet: Eton, Horton, Hythe End, Magna Carta Island, Sunnymeads, Wraysbury, and the houses on the north side of the B376 Wraysbury Road, and on both sides of Gloucester Road, just east of the M25 and NW of Staines, that lie within the Windsor and Maidenhead borough boundary.

Excluded (for the avoidance of doubt): Brands Hill, Chalvey, Clewer Village, Colnbrook, Eton Wick, Old Windsor, Poyle, Runnymede, Upton, Windsor,
