

Science

This half term we will be learning about forces. We will learn about pushes and pulls and magnets.

Computing

This term we will be focusing on algorithms and programming during our computing lessons. We will be using Espresso coding and Scratch.

We will be developing the children's logical thinking and reasoning in order to plan algorithms to animate.

Humanities

During the first half of the term, we will complete learning about the Ancient Egypt. Each lesson will build towards children being able to explain the following statement:

Religion played a crucial role in the everyday life of an Ancient Egyptian and guided their decisions and actions. Agree or Disagree

Children will learn about the River Nile, mummification, the Rosetta stone, pyramids, Gods and Tutankhamun.

Art/DT

Children will learn how about how to create tone using graded pencils.

They will work on creating still art pieces inspired by Michelangelo Caravaggio.

Music

In music, we will be exploring musical expression by differing dynamics and tempos when using instruments and voices. We will be discussing the effects changing dynamics and tempos have on an audience.

We will sing 'Three Little Birds' and to Reggae music.

<u>PE</u>

Children will be doing Gymnastics and Dance.

The children will be developing their football skills, focusing on turning, how to beat an opponent, passing over a short distance and playing in small sided games. They will also develop their netball skills, working on their ability to pass the ball using a chest pass, jump stops and pivoting. These skills will then be put to the test in small sided games.

Please try to hear your child read at least four times a week and discuss the characters, events and key themes of the text. It's better to read just a few pages and discuss them, rather than reading lots of pages. It is also beneficial for children to be read to by an adult, ideally once a week.
